A regularly scheduled meeting of the Township of Liberty was held in the Municipal Building, 349 Mountain Lake Road, Great Meadows on 4 March 2021. The meeting was opened by Mayor John Inscho with Adequate Notice of Meeting and the Pledge of Allegiance at 7:00 p.m.

#### **REPORTS**

# COMMITTEEPERSON GROVER

Mr Grover reported that the Great Meadows Regional Board of Education Budget would be receiving reduced State funding over the 2020 contribution. The Middle school is being scheduled as a COVID testing site on Wednesday afternoons. Governor Murphy is pushing to have school teachers vaccinated so the schools may reopen for in person learning.

#### MAYOR INSCHO

Mayor Inscho thanked the Department of Public Works and contractors for getting Liberty Township through a long February with extensive snow accumulations.

# **PRESENTATION**

Mayor Inscho acknowledged Jonathan Buchanan and Kayla Breslin as recipients of the 2020 Rosenkranz Award, for recognition of their academic and athletic accomplishments through their kindergarten - eighth grade years at Great Meadows Regional Board of Education.

# **PRESENTATION**

Corey Piasecki, PP/AICP NJ Highlands Council, attended this Liberty Township meeting via conference call with his co-worker James Humphrey. Mr Piasecki stated that he was available to assist Liberty Township with the pursuit of their initial assessment for Highland Plan conformance to align the municipal and sate masterplan for Liberty Township. Work would be coordinated with Eric Snyder, Liberty Township Planner, and expenses reimbursed by Highlands. He stated that attention would be directed toward addressing the Hazardous Algae Bloom within Mountain Lake and the practice of Highlands's exemptions for property development projects. Discussion with public input pursued. In conclusion, the Township Committee agreed to address the outstanding reimbursement from 2009 Highlands Phase I Study before proceeding with a current assessment.
