Public Comment Adjournment

A regularly scheduled meeting of the Township of Liberty was held in the Municipal Building, 349 Mountain Lake Road, Great Meadows on 6 June 2024. The meeting was opened by Mayor John Inscho with Adequate Notice of Meeting and the Pledge of Allegiance at 7:09 p.m.

Present: Mayor John Inscho; Deputy Mayor Daniel Grover; David Rogers; Wayne Spangenberg; and, Peter Karcher

Also, Present: Richard Wenner, Municipal Attorney; and, Diane M Pflugfelder, Municipal Clerk/Administrator

REPORTS

WAYNE SPANGENBERG – A motion by Wayne Spangenberg to approve the Recreation Commission request to coordinate a yoga program at the John R Fisher Pavilion on Wednesday evenings with donation fees collected carried.

DAN GROVER – Mr. Grover advised those present of the NJ law allowing the GMRBOE to have a 2024-2025 tax levy increase proposal up to 15% without a public vote. He stated that the GMRBOE was proposing a 9.9% increase which would equate to an \$200 tax increase on a Liberty Township home assessed at \$300,000. Everyone present was encouraged to attend the next GMRBOE meeting scheduled for Monday, 10 June, 7 pm at the Great Meadows Regional Middle School.

JOHN INSCHO – Mayor Inscho reported that he and Wayne Spangenberg conducted lifeguard interviews on 5 June 2024 and that training would be coordinated for next weekend. A motion by Mayor Inscho to hire 7 first year lifeguards, starting salary at \$16.00/hour and 1 beach manager at \$18.00/hour carried.

A motion by Mayor Inscho to hire Albert Mercurio as DPW Summer help at \$25.00/hour carried.

A motion by Mayor Inscho to coordinate a painted mural on the ole ice cream stand located along Lakeside Drive East carried. The governing body will accept mural proposal pictures to make a final award.

Mayor Inscho stated that a 30' dogwood tree was being purchased by Tim Terri in memorial to Ron Petersen and to be placed on the municipal complex next to the Romanowitch snowplow. Mayor also stated that the DPW driveway would be named "Petersen Way".

BOND ORDINANCE #2024.004

BOND ORDINANCE AUTHORIZING VARIOUS ROAD IMPROVEMENTS IN AND BY THE TOWNSHIP OF LIBERTY, IN THE COUNTY OF WARREN, STATE OF NEW JERSEY, APPROPRIATING \$1,000,000 THEREOF, AND AUTHORIZING THE ISSUANCE OF \$ 950,000 BONDS OR NOTES TO FINANCE PART OF THE COST THEREOF

BE IT ORDAINED by the Township Committee of the Township of Liberty, in the County of Warren, State of New Jersey, as follows:

Section 1. The Township of Liberty, in the County of Warren, State of New Jersey (the "Township") is hereby authorized to make various road improvements, in, by and for said Township, as more particularly described in Section 4 hereof. The cost of the improvements includes all work, materials and appurtenances necessary and suitable therefor.

Section 2. There is hereby appropriated to the payment of the cost of making the improvements described in Sections 1 and 4 hereof (hereinafter referred to as "purposes"), the respective amounts of money hereinafter stated as the appropriation for said respective purposes. Said appropriation shall be met from the proceeds of the sale of the bonds authorized, and the down payment appropriated, by this ordinance. Said improvements shall be made as general improvements and no part of the cost thereof shall be assessed against property specially benefited.

Section 3. It is hereby determined and stated that the making of such improvements is not a current expense of said Township.

Section 4. The purpose hereby authorized for the financing of which said obligations are to be issued are set forth in the following "Schedule of Improvement, Purpose and Amount" which schedule also shows (1) the amount of the appropriation and the estimated cost of such purpose, and (2) the amount of each sum which is to be provided by the down payment hereinafter appropriated to finance such purposes, and (3) the estimated maximum amount of bonds and notes to be issued for such purpose, and (4) the period of usefulness, according to its reasonable life, computed from the date of said bond:

SCHEDULE OF IMPROVEMENT, PURPOSE AND AMOUNT

A. Undertaking of improvements to various roads, as set forth on a list prepared or to be prepared by the Township Engineer and placed on file with the Township Clerk and hereby approved as if set forth herein in full. Depending upon the contract price and other exigent circumstances, and upon approval by the Township Committee, there may be additions to or deletions from the aforesaid list. It is

hereby determined and stated that said roads being improved are of "Class B" or equivalent construction as defined in Section 22 of the Local Bond Law (Chapter 2 of Title 40A of the New Jersey Statutes Annotated, as amended; the "Local Bond Law").

Section 5. The cost of such purpose, as hereinbefore stated, includes the aggregate amount of \$80,000.00 which is estimated to be necessary to finance the cost of such purposes, including architect's fees, accounting, engineering and inspection costs, legal expenses and other expenses, including interest on such obligations to the extent permitted by Section 20 of the Local Bond Law.

Section 6. It is hereby determined and stated that moneys exceeding \$50,000, appropriated for down payments on capital improvements or for the capital improvement fund in budgets heretofore adopted for said Township, are now available to finance said purposes. The sum of \$50,000.00 is hereby appropriated from such moneys to the payment of the cost of said purposes.

Section 7. To finance said purposes, bonds or notes of said Township of an aggregate principal amount not exceeding \$950,000.00 are hereby authorized to be issued pursuant to the Local Bond Law. Said bonds or notes shall bear interest at a rate per annum as may be hereafter determined within the limitations prescribed by law. All matters with respect to said bonds not determined by this ordinance shall be determined by resolutions to be hereafter adopted.

Section 8. To finance said purposes, bond anticipation notes of said Township of an aggregate principal amount not exceeding \$950,000.00 are hereby authorized to be issued pursuant to the Local Bond Law in anticipation of the issuance of said bonds. In the event that bonds are issued pursuant to this ordinance, the aggregate amount of notes hereby authorized to be issued shall be reduced by an amount equal to the principal amount of the bonds so issued. If the aggregate amount of outstanding bonds and notes issued pursuant to this ordinance shall at any time exceed the sum first mentioned in this section, the moneys raised by the issuance of said bonds shall, to not less than the amount of such excess, be applied to the payment of such notes then outstanding.

Section 9. Each bond anticipation note issued pursuant to this ordinance shall be dated on or about the date of its issuance and shall be payable not more than one year from its date, shall bear interest at a rate per annum as may be hereafter determined within the limitations prescribed by law and may be renewed from time to time pursuant to and within limitations prescribed by the Local Bond Law. Each of said bond anticipation notes shall be signed by the mayor and by the Chief Financial Officer and shall be under the seal of said Township and attested by the Township Clerk. Said officers are hereby authorized to execute said notes in such form as they may adopt in conformity with law. The power to determine any matters with respect to said notes not determined by this ordinance and also the power to sell said notes, is hereby delegated to the Chief Financial Officer who is hereby authorized to sell said notes either at one time or from time to time in the manner provided by law.

Section 10. It is hereby determined and declared that the average period of usefulness of the purposes, according to their reasonable lives, taking into consideration the respective amounts of bonds or notes authorized for said purposes, is a period of 10 years computed from the date of said bonds.

Section 11. It is hereby determined and stated that the Supplemental Debt Statement required by the Local Bond Law has been duly made and filed in the office of the Township Clerk of said Township, and that such statement so filed shows that the gross debt of said Township, as defined in Section 43 of the Local Bond Law, is increased by this ordinance by \$950,000.00 and that the issuance of the bonds and notes authorized by this ordinance will be within all debt limitations prescribed by said Local Bond Law.

Section 12. Any funds received from private parties, the County of Warren, the State of New Jersey or any of their agencies or any funds received from the United States of America or any of its agencies in aid of such purposes, shall be applied to the payment of the cost of such purposes, or, if bond anticipation notes have been issued, to the payment of the bond anticipation notes, and the amount of bonds authorized for such purposes shall be reduced accordingly.

Section 13. The Township intends to issue the bonds or notes to finance the cost of the improvements described in Sections 1 and 4 of this bond ordinance. If the Township incurs such costs prior to the issuance of the bonds or notes, the Township hereby states its reasonable expectation to reimburse itself for such expenditures with the proceeds of such bonds or notes in the maximum principal amount of bonds or notes authorized by this bond ordinance.

Section 14. The full faith and credit of the Township are hereby pledged to the punctual payment of the principal of and the interest on the obligations authorized by this ordinance. Said obligations shall be direct, unlimited and general obligations of the Township, and the Township shall levy ad valorem taxes upon all the taxable real property within the Township for the payment of the principal of and interest on such bonds and notes, without limitation as to rate or amount.

Section 15. The capital budget is hereby amended to conform with the provisions of this ordinance to the extent of any inconsistency therewith and the resolutions promulgated by the Local Finance Board showing full detail of the amended capital budget and capital program as approved by the Director, Division of Local Government Services, is on file with the Township Clerk and is available for public inspection.

Section 16. This ordinance shall take effect twenty days after the first publication thereof after final passage.

The Bond Ordinance published herewith was introduced and passed on first reading at a meeting of the Governing Body of Liberty Township, in the County of Warren, State of New Jersey on 2 May 2024. It will be further considered for final passage after public hearing at a meeting of said Governing Body to held at the Liberty Township Municipal Building on 6 June 2024beginning at 7:00 pm. During the week prior to and including the date of such meeting, copied of the full ordinances will be made available at no cost and during the regular business hours at the Municipal Clerks' office for members of the general public who shall request the same. RESOLUTION #2024.052

WHEREAS, N.J.S.A. 40A: 5-4 requires the Governing Body of every local unit to have made an annual audit of its books, accounts and financial transactions; and

WHEREAS, the Annual Report of Audit for the year 2023 has been filed by a Registered Municipal Accountant with the Municipal Clerk pursuant to N.J.S.A. 40A:5-6 and a copy has been received by each member of the Governing Body; and

WHEREAS, R.S. 52:2788-34 authorizes the Local Finance Board of the State of New Jersey to prescribe reports pertaining to the local fiscal affairs; and

WHEREAS, the Local Finance Board has promulgated N.J.A.C. 50:30-6.5, a regulation requiring that the governing body of each municipality shall, by Resolution, certify to the Local Finance Board of the State of New Jersey that all members of the governing body have reviewed, as a minimum, the sections of the annual audit entitled "Comments and Recommendations"; and

WHEREAS, the members of the governing body have personally reviewed, as a minimum, the Annual Report of Audit, and specifically the sections of the Annual Audit entitled "Comments and Recommendations", as evidenced by the group affidavit form of the governing body attached hereto; and

WHEREAS, such Resolution of certification shall be adopted by the Governing Body no later than forty-five days after the receipt of the annual audit, pursuant to N.J.A.C. 5:30-6.5; and

WHEREAS, all members of the governing body have received and have familiarized themselves with, at least, the minimum requirements of the Local Finance Board of the State of New Jersey, as stated aforesaid and have subscribed to the affidavit, as provided by the Local Finance Board; and

WHEREAS, failure to comply with the regulations of the Local Finance Board of the State of New Jersey may subject the members of the local governing body to the penalty provisions of R.S. 52:27BB-52 to wit:

"R.S. 52:27BB-52. A local officer or member of a local Governing Body who, after a date fixed for compliance, fails or refuses to obey an order of the Director of Local Government Services, under the provisions of this Article, shall be guilty of a misdemeanor and, upon convictions, may be fined not more than one thousand dollars (\$1,000.00) or imprisoned for not more than one year, or both, in addition shall forfeit his office".

NOW, THERFORE, BE IT RESOLVED, That the governing body of the Township of Liberty hereby states that is has complied with N.J.A.C. 5:30-6.5 and does hereby submit a certified copy of this Resolution and the required affidavit to said Board to show evidence of said compliance.

NJDEP ENVIRONMENTAL REGULATION BILLING FOR MUNICIPAL STORMWATER – TIER A GENERAL PERMIT

An invoice was received 13 May 2024 from NJ Department of Environmental Protection for Environmental Regulation – NJDES in the amount of \$1,050.00 for Municipal Stormwater – Tier A General Permit (R9). As a previous Tier B municipality, Liberty Township had been invoiced for \$500.00. Mayor Inscho stated that he is working on a plan similar to Hopatcong.

UPDATED STORMWATER MANAGEMETN ORDINANCE

An email of 25 April 2024 was received from Cristine Petroni, Stormwater Compliance Solutions, LLC advising Liberty Township of the updated Stormwater Management ordinance proposal from July 2023 that incorporates the Inland Flood Protection Rule regulations. Municipalities are required to adopt the updated SCO (Stormwater Control Ordinance) by 18 July 2024. The Ordinance will be sent to the municipal LandUse Board for their 19 June meeting and then to the Warren County Planning Department for review.

PUBLIC ACCESS VIA TO MOUNTIAN LAKE VIA BLOCK 51, LOT 13

A resident posed a question regarding the definition of the hash lines on the Liberty Township tax map as public access or private property. Mayor Inscho stated that the hash lines on the Liberty Township tax map indicate a municipal stormwater easement not public access to Mountain Lake. Muscara, owner of 15 Hillside, stated that the area in question was his deeded access to Mountain Lake and he had the right to use this area. Attorney Wenner stated this is a private matter and the municipality has no jurisdiction in the matter.

MOUNTAIN LAKE FIRE COMPANY REQUEST FOR COMMUNITY DAY PARADE TRAFFIC FLOW

Joe Thomas made a request of the Governing Body for Community Day/Fire Company Anniversary Celebration Parade to be conducted on 17 August 2024 with the road closed between Lodge and Noll Drive for parking and public access. Mayor Inscho advised that the Mountain Lake Firehouse speak with Steve Ciecwicz. OEM Coordinator, for Warren County and NJSP communications.
