NONPOINT SOURES FUNDING WITH MOUNTAIN LAKE COMMUNITY ASSOCIATION A motion by Pete Karcher to adopt the following Resolution carried.

RESOLUTION #2022.019 NONSOURCE FUNDING APPLICATION

WHEREAS, Mountain Lake (hereafter known as the Lake) is a popular, public accessible, recreational waterbody located in Liberty Township, Warren County, NJ (hereafter known as the Township); and

WHEREAS, the Lake offers a variety of a recreational amenities to the residents of the Township; and

WHEREAS, the Lake is known to experience a variety of water quality problems including high densities of submerged aquatic vegetation and periodic Harmful Algal Blooms (HABs); and

WHEREAS, HABs are known to pose a direct health hazard to humans as well as pets who may drink the water and wildlife who may live in the Lake; and

WHEREAS, the development of a Lake / Watershed Plan would develop a strategy toward addressing these water quality problems on a short and long term basis; and

WHEREAS, the Township is seeking funds from the New Jersey Department of Environmental Protection (NJDEP) through the 319 / 604(b) Planning grant program to cover the costs associated with the development of the Plan; and WHEREAS, grant applications are due by the 28th of February 2022 and the Township will work with Princeton Hydro to submit a grant application at no charge to the Township; and

WHEREAS, if the Township is awarded funding thorough the Planning grant program that Princeton Hydro would conduct the consulting and monitoring services associated with the project. WHEREAS, the total amount of requested funds is to be approximately \$83,000, which will cover the consulting and monitoring services associated with the project.

NOW, THEREFORE, BE IT RESOLVED by the Township of Liberty that on this the 3rd of February 2022 the Township authorizes Princeton Hydro to provide the Township with material for a 319 / 604(b) Planning grant application to be submitted to the NJDEP by the 28th of February 2022, requesting funds for the development of a Lake / Watershed Plan for Mountain Lake at no cost to the Township.

BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED that if the Township of Liberty is awarded funds through the NJDEP's Planning grant program that associated monitoring and consulting services will be conducted by Princeton Hydro, to be paid through the grant.
