## STORMWATER MANAGEMENT IN LIBERTY TOWNSHIP

Stormwater is from rainfall or snowmelt that washes pollutants into our storm drains and directly into our rivers, streams and lakes.

We ask residents to reduce runoff from your property and reduce pollution in runoff. Liberty Township has three non-point source pollution control ordinances to help protect our water:

- Prohibit the feeding of waterfowl (No. 02-07)
- Limit the application of phosphorus fertilizer near water (No. 02-06)
- Regulate the disposal of pet waste (No. 02-08)

Liberty Township is proud of our natural beauty and healthy environment. Every person who lives here has a hand in keeping it clean. How we use our land and what we put in our drains eventually runs off or seeps into our water. The above ordinances help to protect our surface and drinking waters.



## DPW INFORMATION

The Township has received inquiries of falling dead or dying trees. The Township is not responsible for, and will not assert responsibility for, conditions occurring on private property. Thus if a tree is located on private property, it is the responsibility of the homeowner to maintain and care for said tree. The Township DPW cannot access your property to cut dead trees or fallen trees. It is the responsibility of the landowner to make sure that any unsafe trees are cut down and/or removed from the property. This is also true for trees located within a municipal right of way. A right of way is placed on all properties along the Township roads if the Township needs to potentially widen a road, install drainage, etc. The right of way allows the Township to utilize a section of the property for these necessary repairs but in no way imposes an affirmative obligation on the Township to maintain the right of way. The Township is not responsible for tree maintenance, tree trimming, etc. of trees and vegetation occurring within the right of way.
